BASIC SUMMARY

Development based on The Treaty cannot be substituted by:

- Equal/equitable development
- Culture, cultural differences, cultural safety and intercultural development
- Biculturalism
- Understanding history and colonisation
- Treaty settlements
- Principles of the Treaty e.g. Partnership, Protection and Participation
- The English Version of The Treaty (which was not present on 6 February 1840).

Network Waitangi Otautahi's approach is to develop *Understanding the Treaty* in a framework for the future based on the 5 aspects of the te reo text of the Treaty – Te Tiriti o Waitangi. Preamble: Peace with justice for all

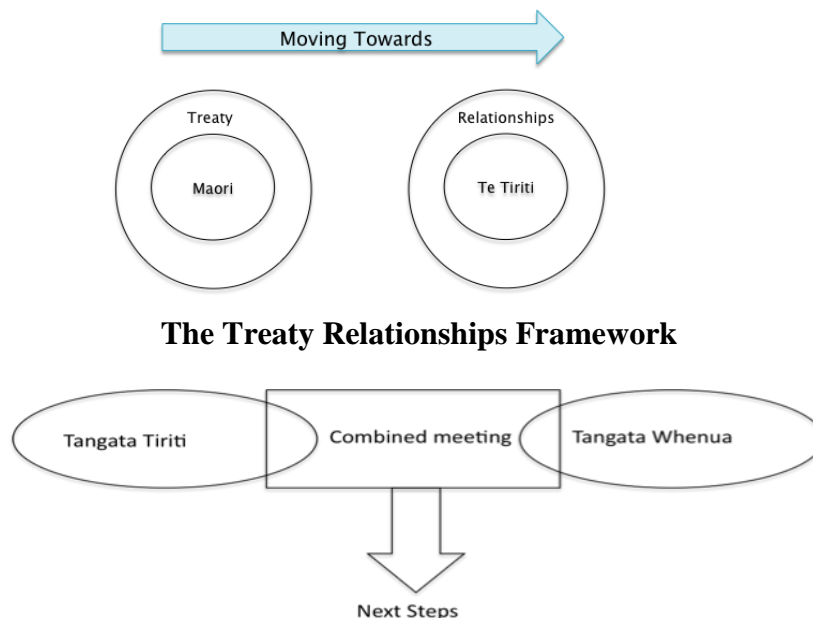
Article 1: Practising KAWANATANGA

Article 2: Promoting TINO RANGATIRATANGA by tangata whenua

Article 3: Maori participation in Kawanatanga in ways determined by Maori in relation to tikanga

Article 4: Everybody's belief systems upheld

need to be taken together as a whole and as a follow-on to the 1835 Declaration



Tangata whenua - people who whakapapa to a Maori ancestor
Tangata Tiriti - people who have no whakapapa to Maori ancestry but reside in NZ
or are NZ citizens
