
This workshop will be run by Network Waitangi Otautahi www.nwo.org.nz and starts where people are. It is non-confrontational. This opportunity is not only introductory, it is designed to refresh your understanding and clarify what the Treaty means today. It will explore: ancestry, cultural difference and cultural safety; pre-Treaty and post-Treaty history; colonisation and social statistics, and new ways of thinking, living and working. Models and possible actions in 2021 for moving towards a Treaty-based society will also be considered.

A handbook of resources is provided so note-taking is not necessary. In addition to the handouts a booklet titled *The Treaty of Waitangi Questions and Answers (2019)* will be available to purchase for \$5 – please bring cash on the day for this. Tea and coffee provided but please bring your own lunch.

Canterbury Regional Council (Ngāi Tahu Representation) Bill

ex TRONT CEO Arihia Bennett:

You may remember this bill, which was rejected at its first reading in Parliament in April 2019. Its purpose was to empower Te Rūnanga to appoint up to two Ngāi Tahu representatives to Environment Canterbury. I am pleased to report that just this week I received an update from Environment Canterbury Chief Executive Stefanie Rixecker to say the Council voted unanimously to proceed with the local bill. The next step is to begin lobbying the central government.

Succinct summary of the history of Maori in State care in New Zealand

At a recent hearing of the Royal Commission of Inquiry into abuse in State Care, Anne Toohey gave an opening address which included a history of Maori and the disproportionate numbers who were moved to State care.

Dr Te Maire Tau, chairman of Ngāi Tahu freshwater group Te Kura Taka Pini, said Leader of the Opposition Judith Collins' claims were wrong and the iwi was not proposing to take ownership of three waters assets.

"Ngāi Tahu does not want to own three waters infrastructure."

The iwi had instead been discussing co-governance options with the Government as a safeguard against any attempts by future governments to privatise water assets.
