

# Taranaki Maunga bill: What creating 'legal personhood' means




A bill granting Taranaki Maunga and its associated peaks legal personhood is expected to pass into law tomorrow. Te Pire Whakatupua mō Te Kāhui Tupua/Taranaki Maunga Collective Redress bill will have its second and third readings in Parliament to officially recognise the peaks — Taranaki, Panitahi, Patuhā, Kaitake and Pouākai — as ancestral mountains who will jointly become a legal person under the name of Te Kāhui Tupua. - Read here and here
